

## **Stephanie Hutter-Thomas, PhD, CPH, RPS, CCHW Biography**

Dr. Stephanie Hutter-Thomas is the research program director for the Buprenorphine Implementation Research & Community Health (BIRCH) study, WVU School of Medicine; an educator and consultant for the Maryland Rural Opioid Technical Assistance (MarylandROTA) program through the University of Maryland Extension; and founder of Appalachian Recovery Concepts, LLC. Since 2016, Stephanie has served the Western MD region as a researcher, community educator, and harm reduction advocate addressing stigma, mental health literacy, and promoting peer support services. She is actively involved in multiple community action groups including Healing Allegany Consortium with AHEC West, the Stand Together Garrett Coalition with the Garrett Co Health Dept, and the Allegany College Community Resilience Collaborative. As a Mental Health First Aid instructor, she has provided over 65 workshops since becoming an instructor in 2018, certifying more than 500 Mental Health First Aiders. Dr. Hutter-Thomas is also a member of the Frostburg State University Institutional Review Board, the Mental Health Advisory Board of Allegany County MD, the Archway Station board of directors, the Allegany Arts Council board of directors, and the Maryland Coalition of Families board of directors.
