## Intercept 1 Law Enforcement / Emergency Services

**Crisis Hotlines**  
 Eastern Shore Operational Center (ESOC) – 24/7, Life Crisis Center, Suicide, Veterans, Family Violence, MD Crisis Hotlines, FAS – Rape Crisis & Sexual Assault, LGBTQ

Dispatch 911  
 Each county has a separate dispatch

**Law Enforcement Police Departments**  
 Easton, Trappe, St. Michaels, Oxford, Centreville, Cambridge, Chestertown, Rock Hall, Denton, Federalsburg, Greensboro, Hurlock, Preston, Ridgely, MD State Police, County Sheriff's

**University of Maryland Healthcare System**  
 Counties D, K, T have a hospital and emergency, C does not have a hospital/ED, D (Shore Medical Center) has inpatient psychiatric Unit w/24 beds, T&D ER's request MCT do follow-up checks, QA has free standing ED

**Mid-Shore MH Systems Mobile Crisis Teams (MCT) – serves 8 counties**  
 4 regional MCT's (6 members per team) provide crisis intervention, assessments, supportive counseling, referrals, linkage to MH services, peer support, co-respond with law enforcement & probation

**Crisis Beds**  
 4 crisis beds

**Veteran Services**  
 VA community based outpatient clinic (Cambridge), VA Hospital (Baltimore), VJO services

**Peer Resources**  
 Peer ED diversion (D), Recovery in Motion (K), Chesapeake Voyager, Inc. (all 5 counties), The Dorchester Recovery Initiative DRI-Dock (D), AA/NA (C, D), Recovery For Shore (all 5 counties)

## Intercept 2 Initial Detention / Initial Court Hearings

**1<sup>st</sup> Appearance**  
 takes place at District Court – District Court Commissioner determines if there is probable cause

**Arraignment – District Court**  
 District Court Commissioner formally charges individual and a plea is entered, bail can be set or released on own recognizance, or held w/ no bail – pre-trial services does assessment

**Circuit Court**  
 1 in each county – hears more serious felony cases

**District Court**  
 34 courts in 12 jurisdictions, mostly handles misdemeanors

**Problem-Solving Courts**  
 Adult Drug Court (C&D), Truancy Reduction Court (D&T), K & QA have no problem solving courts, Problem Solving - adult, drug, rehab, reentry (T)

**Jail/Detention Center**  
 Correct Care Solutions – mental health & medical provider (D, K, T & QA), serves 1800 individuals annually, psychiatrist on call 24/7 – 2-4 hrs at each jail, services: screening, evaluation, crisis services, therapy, medication management, suicide prevention programs, educational groups, & care coordination, substance abuse Tx (D, K, T & QA), TAMAR for women (C&D) limited reentry services, released with 30 day med supply

**Court Orders for Substance Use**  
 8805 – Evaluation  
 8507 – Inpatient Treatment

**Forensic Mental Health Program**  
 (part of Mid-Shore MH) – Screenings: behavioral health, intelligence disability, violence risk assessment, & recidivism risk assessment. Makes recommendations to courts and public defenders & links consumers to community resources, average 48 on case load – see approximately 270 per year.

**Eastern Shore Hospital Center (ESHC)**  
 3 psychiatric units (60 beds) – competency restoration

**Prison**  
 First state prison system in the country to be awarded licenses for methadone use from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration

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**Transportation**  
 Delmarva Community Transit – One Stop (C, D & K), Maryland Upper Shore Transit (MUST Bus) (QA), MTA Commuter Bus (QA), Upper Shore Take A Ride (C, K & T)

## Intercept 5 Community Corrections / Community Support

**The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS)**  
 Parole and Probation – Presentence investigative reports, Parole & Probation Enforcement Program, Pre-trial release serves: investigative, case management, case diversion, and detention, Motivational Interviewing, no specialized caseloads, not CIT trained

**Housing**  
 Shelter Plus Housing (25 beds), Continuum of Care Housing (16 beds), Residential Rehabilitation (70 beds), Main Street Housing (19 units), women and children's shelter (C – 4 units), Haven Ministry Shelter (under development – QA), Talbot Interfaith Shelter (T), Winter Shelters (C, D, K, QA & T)

Recovery Houses: Crest House, Second Step, Fresh Start, New Beginnings, DRI-Dock

**Cross County Services**  
 MH outpatient Tx, Psych Rehab, Intensive outpatient Tx, Targeted Case Management, Outpatient Addictions Specialists, Inpatient Mental Health and Substance Use
